

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day ceremony and contests planned

In honor of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, the City of Cerritos will host a special celebration on Monday, January 15 at 10 a.m. in the Sierra Room of the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA). The public is invited to attend this free event, which will include remarks by the Cerritos City Council and community involvement through songs and comments.

As part of the City's Martin Luther King, Jr. Day celebration, the Cerritos Library is sponsoring art and writing contests for students. The art contest is open to students in kindergarten through grade 12. Participants may submit one art entry, no larger than 12" x 18," using any drawing or painting materials.

The writing contest is open to students in grades 7 through 12. Participants may submit one writing entry, which may be a poem or an essay with no more than 300 words, preferably typed on letter-size paper.

All art and writing contest entries should represent the theme of "Living the Dream: It Starts With Me – Spreading Hope, Courage and Unity." Contest entry forms are available at the Cerritos Library and on the City's website at cerritos.us. City to help fund Cerritos Auto Square sign upgrades

The Cerritos City Council has agreed to help pay for upgrades to the existing Cerritos Auto Square digital sign, which serves as an advertising mechanism for the center.

Under an agreement with the Cerritos Auto Square Dealer's Association, the City will provide financial assistance not to exceed \$892,191 for improvements to the sign along the San Gabriel Freeway (I-605). Fifty percent of the total project costs will be reimbursed to the City with interest over a five-year term.

The sign was last upgraded in 2013. The existing digital display panels are operating at less than half their brightness levels due to age. Furthermore, the parts needed to maintain the panels are difficult to procure and are no longer under manufacturer's warranty. The average lifespan of high-quality digital display panels is typically between seven and 10 years.

The Cerritos Auto Square generates about \$1.5 billion in sales annually, with the City receiving approximately \$14.8 million sales tax revenues yearly.

Tree maintenance contract awarded

The Cerritos City Council recently awarded a \$2,754,250 four-year tree-maintenance contract to Golden West Arbor Services, Inc.

The Pomona-based company will trim approximately 27,230 trees during the four-year term. This tree-trimming cycle is consistent with the International Society of Arboriculture standards.

The contract covers essential tree-related maintenance services in addition to basic contract tree trimming. Essential contract services include emergency after-hour tree removal and trimming services, necessary tree planting and specialized tree trimming.
