African American History Month Lecture Series

Please join the Cerritos Library as we celebrate African American History Month with a special lecture series featuring Dr. Keith Claybrook, Jr., Associate Professor, Department of Africana Studies at California State University, Long Beach; Dr. Alice Nicholas, Africologist and Assistant Professor, Department of Africana Studies at California State University, Long Beach; and Dr. Natalie Sartin, Department Chair of Black/Africana Studies at Cerritos College. These lectures will explore the rich history of Black History commemorations in the United States and emphasize the importance of preserving the traditions of observance, remembrance, and education for future generations.

Preserving the Past, Transforming the Present, and Building the Future: One Hundred Years of Committed Black History Commemorations

This presentation honors the centennial of the inaugural weeklong observance of Black History Week, launched in 1926 by Dr. Carter G. Woodson and the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History now known as the Association for African American Life and History (ASALH). In this first panel discussion, speakers will explore the historical and cultural significance of commemorations in Black history and underscore the urgency of preserving these traditions of observance, remembrance, and learning for future generations. The presentation will also include a brief introduction to the subsequent Black History Month presentations in February at the Cerritos Library. Presented by Dr. M. 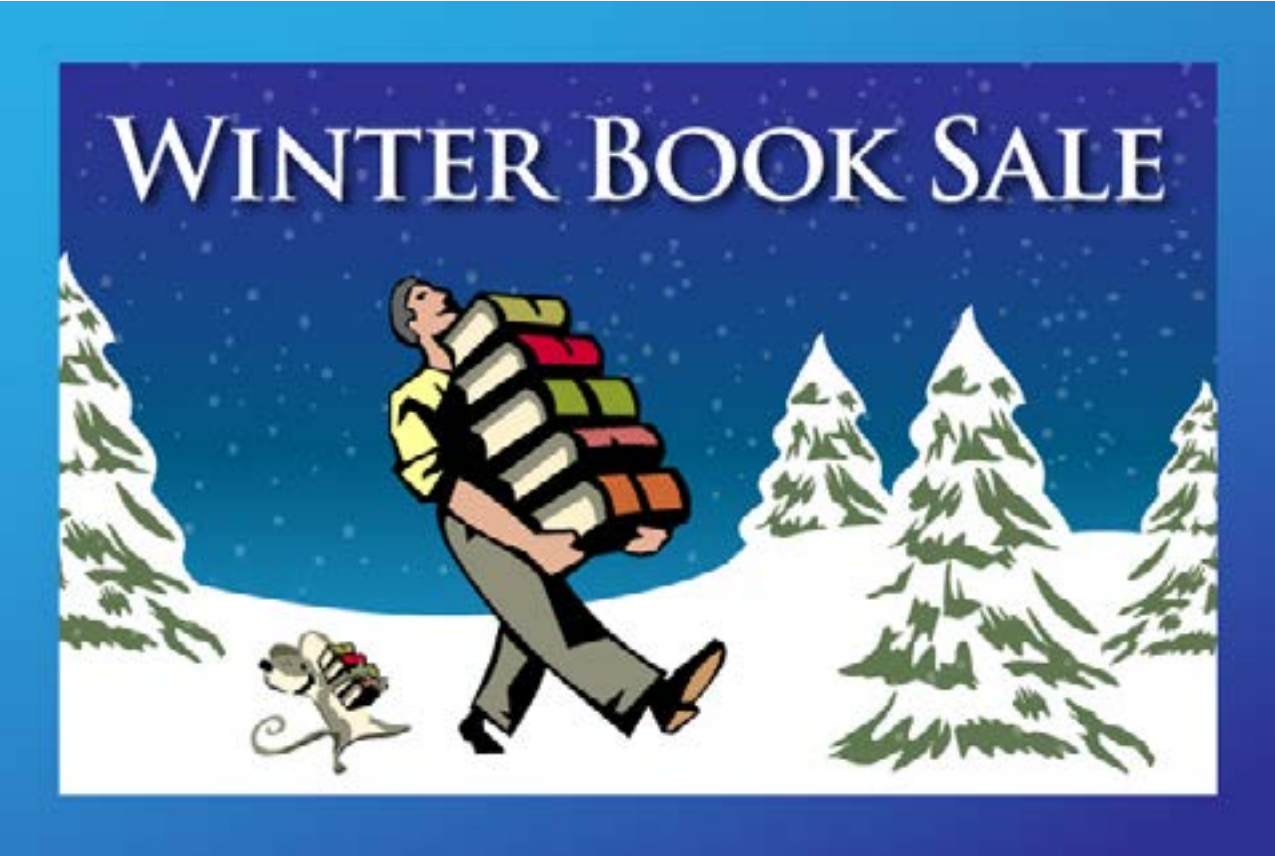
Meet Children’s Author Tamika Burgess

Making Space for Joy: Curating Asian Pacific American History at the Smithsonian

What goes on behind the scenes at the world’s largest museum? Join curator Theodore S. Gonzalves for an engaging talk that pulls back the curtain on curatorial work at the Smithsonian Institution—and on how objects, stories, and communities shape what we remember as history. Gonzalves discusses his award-winning book—*Smithsonian Asian Pacific American History, Art, and Culture in 101 Objects*—that rethinks Asian Pacific American history through everyday things like sports, art, popular culture, and play. The program wraps up with a lively look at the book’s chapter focused on “Joy,” where surfing, skateboarding, baseball, toys, and humor reveal how joy has always been part of Asian Pacific American life—even in times of struggle. This talk invites audiences to see history in a new way and to consider how creativity, play, and joy help us imagine more expansive futures. Participants will have an opportunity to purchase Dr. Theodore Gonzalves’s book and have it signed following his presentation. The *Making History, Making Change* Lecture Series is organized by Smithsonian Affiliations as part of the Smithsonian’s Our Shared Future: 250. Writers Festival Presented by the Friends of the Cerritos Library

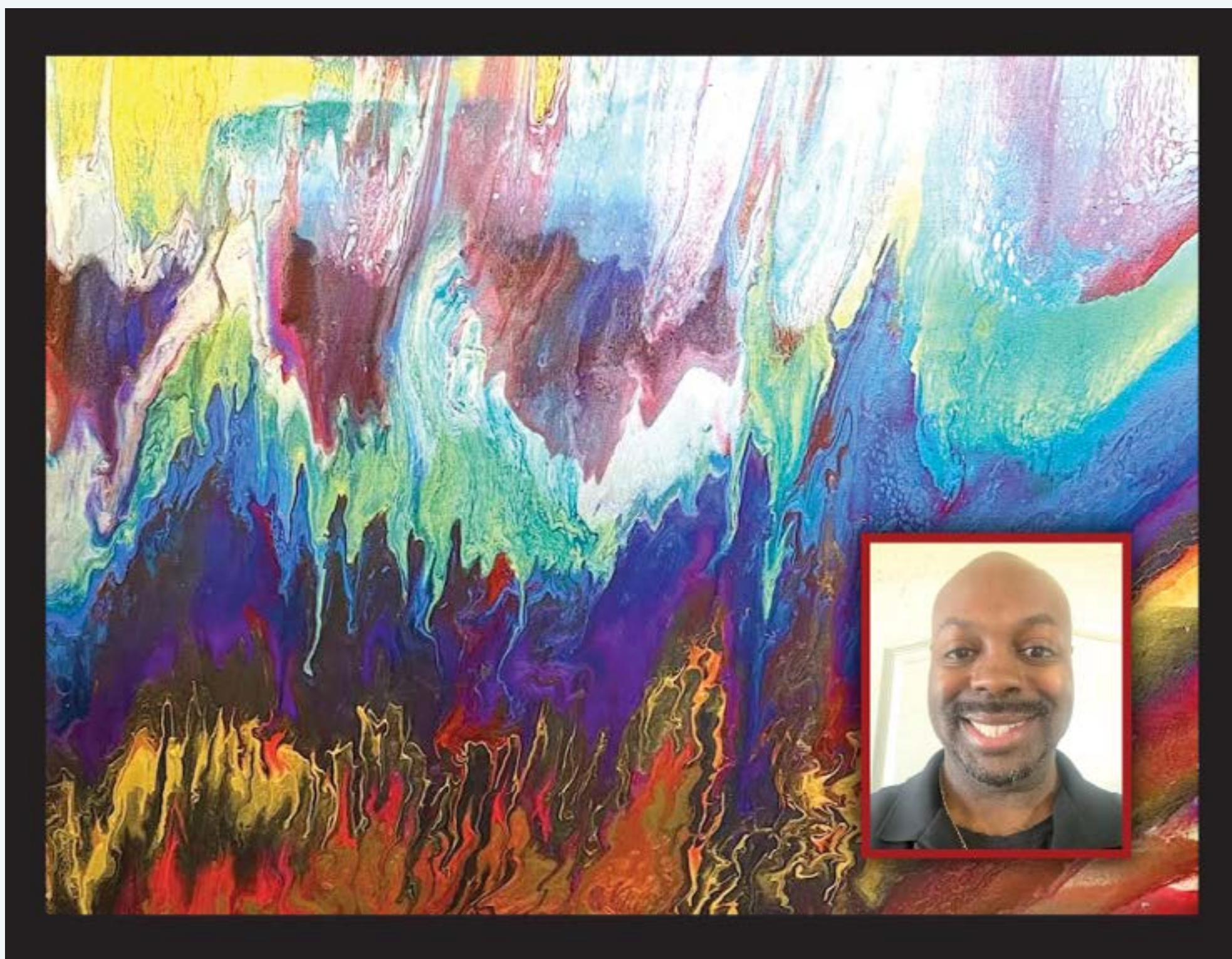
