Official Cerritos City Council Candidate Nomination Period closes December 6

There will be three seats open on the Cerritos City Council for the Tuesday, March 4, 2025 general municipal election. The official candidate nomination period opened Tuesday, November 12, 2024 at 8 a.m. and runs through Friday, December 6, 2024 at 5 p.m. sharp in the Office of the Cerritos City Clerk/Elections Official. If an eligible incumbent does not file nomination papers by the Friday, December 6, 2024 deadline, the official candidate nomination period is extended to Wednesday, December 11, 2024 at 5 p.m., sharp, for eligible individuals other than eligible incumbents.

Cerritos registered voters who are interested in running for Cerritos City Council are encouraged to schedule appointments with the City Clerk/Elections Official to discuss the candidate nomination process or to receive the official candidate nomination paperwork.

Santa's Holiday Float returns in December

Santa's Holiday Float returns to Cerritos neighborhoods again this month. The program will be offered on seven nights in December and feature a float with Santa traveling through the residential areas of Cerritos. Children will have the opportunity to wave at Santa and enjoy a festive float with music and holiday decorations.

Santa's Holiday Float will travel through the city starting at 6 p.m. Monday, December 9 through Wednesday, December 11; Friday, December 13; and Tuesday, December 17 through Thursday, December 19.

Maps showing the float's route each evening will be posted on the City's website at cerritos.gov by early December. A GPS tracker will be placed on the float to allow residents to track its location each evening through a link on the City's website.

In the event of rain, the float will be canceled for that evening and the route will be rescheduled to another night.

Parents are urged to supervise their children to keep them from running into the streets while the float is passing.

Be cautious of coyotes in Cerritos

Residents are advised to take the following precautions to avoid encounters with coyotes:

- · Feed pets indoors.
- Eliminate potential food and water sources, such as fallen fruit or standing water.
- Keep yards free of thick brush and weeds.
- Enclose the bottoms of porches and decks.
- Keep dogs on a leash at all times when outdoors.
- Keep small animals inside or supervised when outdoors. A fenced yard will not protect small animals because coyotes can easily scale residential fences.

Domestic dogs are especially vulnerable to coyote attacks. Adult coyotes are mainly active at night or in the early morning hours, while young coyotes are often active during the day. California coyotes have adapted to residential neighborhoods, parks and open spaces in urban and suburban areas. They are especially prevalent in areas bordering a flood channel.

Residents who see a coyote in their neighborhood should try to scare it away by shouting, throwing rocks, blowing portable air horns or acting in other aggressive ways in order to reinforce the coyote's fear of people. Motion-sensitive lights on houses or outbuildings may also deter coyotes from approaching.

If an aggressive or fearless coyote approaches you or your pet, consider the following tips:

- Shout in a deep voice.
- Wave your arms.
- Throw objects at the animal.
- Look the coyote directly in the eyes.
- Stand up if you are seated.
- If you are wearing a coat or vest, spread it open like a cape so that you appear larger.
- Retreat from the situation by walking backward slowly. Do not turn your back on the coyote.

The City of Cerritos contracts with Long Beach Animal Care Services to provide a wide range of services, including coyote management. The City of Long Beach has a comprehensive coyote management plan and that plan serves as the de facto plan for Cerritos by extension of the service contract. The majority of cities in the region all have similar coyote management plans as each plan must be in accord with the regulations established by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife.
